

Family Disaster Plan and Personal Survival Guide:

Your family may not be together when disaster strikes. It is important to plan in advance. How will you contact one another? How will you get back together? What will you do in different situations? The Family Disaster Plan is a template and guide that will help you prepare for and survive a disaster. The plan will help you identify the following: exit routes in your residence, reunion locations, utility shutoffs, out-of-area contacts, emergency supplies you should have on hand, and a multitude of other information that will help you in a disaster. AlertSanDiego:

AlertSanDiego, San Diego County's mass notification system, sends current emergency notifications to your registered cell phone, Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) phone, and email address. Listed and unlisted



landlines are already registered in AlertSanDiego. Registering your cell phone or VoIP phone makes it more likely that you will receive an emergency notification. For those without a landline, registering with AlertSanDiego helps ensure you receive an emergency notification.
