The devastating and fast moving Lilac Fire in San Luis Rey Valley (and last year's gas leak in unit 2) highlight the importance of having an emergency response/evacuation plan for the Oceana community. This includes the information we would need to ensure that residents who require assistance can be helped to evacuate their homes in a timely fashion.

If there are people living in your home who will need assistance or if you know of neighbors who would need assistance, please complete this short questionnaire (and help your neighbors who need assistance to complete it). Deliver the forms to the OCA front office as soon as possible.

If you or your neighbor are unable to come to the office with the completed form, please call 760-757-3937 and we'll send someone to your house to **pick it up**. Recently, OSERT volunteers helped provide meals and other aide to the several hundred Oceanside residents evacuated to Oceanside High School during the Lilac Fire.
