I am always excited about the start to a new year as it is full of potential - that applies to OCA as well.

It is hard to believe that in March the association has four positions to fill to continue the work of our Board of Directors. That means for the next couple of months this board will polish off all we have started and get things ready for the "new kids".

By the time you read this, you will:

- Know who we plan to negotiate with as our landscape contractor starting March 1, 2024,
- Know what bylaw or CCR changes will be on the ballot,
- Be able to see what is contained in the final resident handbook.
- Understand how we plan to know our rental composition,
- See approved financials completed by FirstService for August through November, and
- Know who we have chosen to do our audit and taxes for 2023.

All of this was accomplished just recently by a dedicated team: the FirstService employees, our committee members, and the board. One thing that I want to stress is a kind word, instead of combativeness, goes a lot further and actually helps homeowners get what they ask for from our team. It makes the person feel appreciated, encourages them to help, and be open to feedback. We could definitely use a lot more of those kind words as we do the work of our association. A good thing to think of the next time you interact with us in this new year.

News You Can Use

Maintenance

A maintenance schedule has been created for association clean-outs starting in January and will take about 2 to 3 weeks per unit. By the end of summer, all association clean-outs will be inspected. This means that each unit will be reviewed at least once a year.

Waste Management

The additional collection of food waste, separated from other trash and recyclables, begins in January. Additional trash cans are being provided for homeowners to place these green waste items out for collection. More information of this can be found on Waste Management's Web site.

Painting

Unit 12 will be the next unit to be painted. The board approved the contract for AF General to paint the homes in Unit 12. The plan is to rotate through the unit, painting approximately 10 houses at a time

Landscaping

The Ad Hoc Landscape Selection Committee has received bids from multiple landscape contractors and evaluated them on an established evaluation standard. Interviews were done in December and referred to the board for selection. The landscape contract renews beginning March 1, 2024.

CC&Rs.

The board is continuing their research on some major issues identified in these documents to be put up for a vote in 2024.

Rentals in Oceana

Management and the board are working on documenting a rental pool and processes as dictated in the CC&Rs. Homeowners were to provide annual notice by 12/31/23 for each home in OCA.

SiFi Networks

The IT Ad Hoc Committee addressing this met with rep from SiFi Networks. The City of OC Fiber City plan is installing fiber network to every home in Oceanside for free. OCA will need a bulk contract and more on this will come as work on this continues.

Resident Handbook

The proposed Resident Handbook update was provided to legal counsel and homeowners for 30+ day review. Comments were collected and

presented for consideration. The board did a thorough review of the draft handbook with these comments and suggestions included. The revised proposed handbook was sent out for a second review on those changes. Comments are to be submitted by January 20, 2024 and will be adopted at the January board meeting

Tax Preparation

Tax Aide will be providing` free tax preparation to homeowners starting at 8 a.m. on Wednesdays from February 7, 2024 through April 10, 2024 in the Community Room in the Clubhouse.

Emerald Isle




