### Digital Surveys

The **Ad Hoc IT committee** is also ready to release their survey in the next month. Your input on usage of cable TV and internet will impact contracts for these services that the Board is considering.

### Strategic Plan

The Board will be meeting April 22 for a Strategic Planning meeting. There are a few California mandated laws that could affect our landscaping. We will be looking at how we can gradually roll out a plan to be in compliance when those dates kick in. January 1, 2029, The law prohibits 'the HOA from using potable water (fresh drinking water) to irrigate nonfunctional turf. (not used for sports, picnics, walking) Many of our unit's pipes are not separated from the home's potable water.

In 2020 California passed 'the ember resistant zone'. In areas prone to fire, vegetation must be 5' away from the house. We will be checking on whether we are within this zone.

### Painting of Unit 12

Painting is getting under way with homes 1-98 choosing their paint colors and making any homeowner-required repairs such as replacing rotten fascia. Don't worry, if you don't want to hire your own handyman or make the repair yourself, you can hire AF General our selected contractor to make the repairs.

Music has started again every other Friday through-out the summer. Music is from 5:30-7:30. Stop on down and enjoy music, food, and beverages.   state of California, and the wine industry
  had an economic impact of \$276 billion.
- According to the book A history of wine in America by Thomas Pinney, the first American wine was a pink sparkling beverage made in the 1840s in Ohio from a hybrid grape called Catawba.






The new computers and printing capability will enrich the lives of residents who don't own a computer and / or have printing needs. There is a small charge for prints.
